Thoughts From the Pastor

Brothers and sisters in Christ:

Since Christmas falls on a Sunday in 2022, we will miss the Gospel readings for the 1st and 2nd Sundays after Christmas. However, because January 1st is a Sunday in 2023, we will celebrate the Circumcision and Name of Jesus that day (something we usually don't celebrate because it doesn't often fall on a Sunday!).

The Holy Spirit only moved Luke to record one event in Jesus' life (the 12) year old Jesus in the temple) from the time Joseph, Mary, and the child Jesus returned from Egypt and settled in Nazareth to Jesus' baptism. In those first 30 years of His life, "Jesus increased in wisdom and in statue and in favor with God and man" (Luke 2:52 ESV).

Jesus physically grew up as a boy and then as a young man in such a way that He wasn't a trouble maker. He was a model citizen who was very smart. Jesus spiritually grew up during those 30 years as well as He learned the scriptures of the Old Testament. This was pleasing to His heavenly Father who had sent His only Son -- Christ the Lord -- to be the Savior of all people.

For most of us who are reading this, our physical growing days are behind us -- we are in the maintaining stage of life now. Even so, we ask God our heavenly Father to continue to watch over us and care for our physical well-being according to His good and gracious will. However, there are still many "things" in the universe which God created that we all can continue to learn and become more knowledgeable about.

Yet when it comes to spiritual things, no matter what our age or our condition in life might be, God the Father through His Word directs His children, those who are disciples of His Son Jesus Christ, to keep on growing. The Word of God in 2 Peter 3:18 encourages us to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen." (ESV)

This spiritual growing is our challenge for the new church year which began on November 27, 2022 A.D. and for the new calendar year that begins on January 1, 2023 A.D. Therefore, us disciples of Jesus Christ ask the Holy Spirit to assist us, to help us, to move us, and to bless us in our spiritual growth when it comes to Jesus.

Jesus promises that the Holy Spirit will help all His disciples to glow spiritually. For that reason, the Spirit will continue to help us spiritually grow in our Lord and Savior through such things like reading our Bible; worshipping together with other disciples of Jesus; having devotions; receiving Holy Communion often; talking to other people about our faith; visiting folks who are homebound or recuperating; studying God's Word by ourself and with others; and in other ways.

This time of the year can get pretty busy for most of us as Christmas is fast approaching. (I'm writing this on December 8, 2022.) But this is also a very good time for us to grow some more spiritually. Take a few moments to reflect on the reason for the season -- it's the birth of the Savior, Christ the Lord.

Without Jesus Christ in Christmas, there is no hope! With Jesus Christ in Christmas, there is life and salvation for all those who believe!! The Son of God came and did what He was sent to do through His life, suffering, and death. Then Jesus Christ rose from the dead in victory over sin, death, all the forces of evil, and the grave so that all who believe in Him might one day celebrate eternally in heaven with Him!

Remembering the Christ of Christmas brings us joy, peace, and hope no matter how we are doing in life, or where we might be, or what lies ahead in the new year of 2023.

A blessed new year to all in the name of Jesus Christ!

Footprints in the Snow by Karen Begalka

inspired by Mary Sevenson's Footprints in the Sand 1922-1999

Early one Saturday morning in winter after the snow had freshly fallen, I put on my hiking boots and warm coat and gloves to walk to the Post Office. It had



stopped snowing and not a single car or person was in sight. All was quiet. Just me and my Lord, as we talked and walked across a beautiful white blanket of pristine snow. Passing a neighborhood we saw a dad pulling his small daughter on a sled, leaving 2 blade tracks and one set of footprints; reminiscent of how I used to enjoy sledding when I was a child. Years later I would pull my children and then my grandchildren down the same street. Another parallel blade track that I saw was made by Dennis Ashford (a fellow Gideon) who after his stroke gets around in a power-charged wheelchair. Similarly, two skis leave parallel tracks, bringing to my mind of how as an older child I enjoyed snowshoeing, downhill and cross country skiing, as my children did also.


Throughout the various stages of my life, the Lord walked, sledded, skied, snowshoed, drove and traveled with me.

- 1. The Lord was with me through the heart of an elderly neighbor who walked with me to her home and gave me chili and hot cocoa after I had fallen off my sled, tumbling to the bottom of the hill.
- 2. He also was present as my ski instructor walked me to the lodge to warm up with chili and hot cocoa after falling at Ski Acres where I was learning how to downhill ski.
- 3. The Lord was with me when I got lost while cross country skiing and a man led me to the parking lot where my car waited.
- 4. With the help of the Lord and our flashlights, my fiancée and I were led through an evening blizzard at Snow Lakes, safely back down the trail to the car and down the road to a cafe still opened at 3 am where we ate breakfast.

- 5. An angel of the Lord went with me in my fiancee's car down a steep canyon road in the winter where I slipped on black ice and drove off a cliff, landing up-side-down. I climbed out the window without a scratch and noticed that the top of the car was completely smashed except right above my head where the angel sat protecting me. A nice couple drove by and took me to my fiancee's home (who was more concerned about me than his car), as he fed me chili and hot cocoa. (And later, he still married me).
- 6. The Lord was with me one very wintery Sunday when I was on my way to the sidewalk of the church and slipped and fell on the curb with my entire body landing on my right leg. So my husband took me to the hospital.

In all of these cases God worked through caring people (or angels) who offered their help. That's how God works; through his people to help others. Jesus took my fears away and walks or carries me through times of trials and suffering most of the time.

We might not be aware of it, but the Lord is always with us through good times and hard times. He is with us even today as we may often feel troubled during this last year of life for Bethlehem Lutheran Church. He will gather us up and carry us through it all.

THE STORY BEHIND THE HYMN

This Is My Father's World Written in 1901

For the world is Mine, and all its fullness. Psalm 50:12b

Maltbie Babcock was arguably the most remarkable student Syracuse University had ever seen. He was a brilliant scholar with a winning personality. Tall and steel-muscled, he was an outstanding athlete, expert swimmer, & captain of the baseball team. He also directed the university's orchestra, played several instruments, and composed original compositions. A proficient vocalist, he

directed the university glee club. He entertained other students by drawing and doing impersonations. On the side, he was an avid fisherman.

He would have been successful in any profession, but God called him to the ministry; and he became pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in Lockport, New York. It was a beautiful area, near Niagara Falls—and Maltbie enjoyed hiking and running in the hills outside town. Telling his secretary, "I'm going out to see my Father's world," he would run or hike a couple of miles into the countryside where he'd lose himself in nature.

It was during his pastorate at Lockport that he wrote a sixteen-stanza poem, each verse beginning with the words, "This is My Father's World."


In 1886, Maltbie was called to the Brown Memorial Church in Baltimore. While there, he traveled widely and was in great demand on college campuses. He was a fresh, engaging speaker who never failed to stimulate students. In 1899, he moved to the Brick Presbyterian Church in New York City. Here he found it more difficult to take off on his hikes. The work load was enormous, but Maltbie faced it stoically, writing:

Be strong! We are not here to play, to dream, to drift, We have hard work to do and loads to lift; Shun not the struggle. Face it. 'Tis God's gift. Be strong!

When he was 42, his church presented him with a special gift—a pilgrimage to the "Holy Land." With great excitement, Maltbie departed by ship. While enroute at Naples, Italy, he was seized with a deadly bacterial fever and died at the International Hospital on May 18, 1901.

After his death, his wife compiled his writings into a book titled *Thoughts* for Everyday Living, published in 1901. Included was Maltbie's "This Is My Father's World."

MISSION MESSAGE from Art Wolf

As we have been moving through this time where we as a church have decided to close the doors at Bethlehem, in ways, it reminds me of Jesus and of the parable of planting seeds. For Jesus Christ, Bethlehem was the place of his birth, his starting point, where he would start to grow and be what he was supposed to be, according to God's plan. It also reminds me of the seed parable in that as we are no longer going to Bethlehem, we are seeds being spread out. It is up to us to take what we have learned at Bethlehem and use it to give the churches that we spread out to, to help them to grow and continue to grow. That we and the churches that we go to are on the fertile soil, and produce a crop that is thirty, sixty, and even a hundred times as much as had been planted! We need to push them and ourselves to not only make better Christians, but to make more Christians. We need to share the word and couple that with prayer, so that our seeds may grow!

I pulled this devotion from the website adaily devotional.com and it sums it up very well.



The Seeds Of Salvation

Listen! A farmer went out to plant some seed. As he scattered it across his field, some of the seed fell on a footpath and the birds came and ate it. Other seed fell on shallow soil with underlying rock. The seed sprouted quickly because the soil was shallow. But the plant soon wilted under the hot sun, and since it didn't have deep roots it died. Other seed fell among thorns that grew up and

choked out the tender plants so they produced no grain.

Still other seed fell on fertile soil, and they spouted, grew and produced a crop that was thirty, sixty and even a hundred times as much as had been planted! Mark 4:3-8

According to this parable, when we share the Good News of Jesus Christ, when we share His words with others, it is like we are scattering seeds of truth. Those seeds fall on one of four places; a footpath, shallow soil, among thorns and lastly on fertile soil. These analogies represent our recipients hearts.

The seed that falls on the footpath 'represents those who hear the message, only to have satan come at once and take it away' (v15). The seed that falls on the shallow soil 'represents those who hear the message and immediately receive it with joy. But since they don't have deep roots... they fall away as soon as they have problems or are persecuted for believing God's word' (v16-17). Furthermore the seeds that fall among thorns 'represents others who hear God's word, but all too quickly the message is crowded out by the worries of this life, the lure of wealth, and the desire for other things, so no fruit is produced' (18-19). Finally, the seed that falls on fertile soil 'represents those who hear and accept God's word and produce a harvest' (20).

Although God is in control of making the seeds grow that we plant, we must also know that our sharing of God's word, must always be coupled with prayer, so that every seed we sow, may fall on fertile and ready hearts. The increase is God's work, the sharing and praying is ours! We too can also go through seasons in our lives, where we can journey through each of these stages in our own hearts. When we receive the word of God, sometimes we allow the pressures of life to suffocate what we have received. If that is you, then know God's grace is new every morning. Give your 'thorns and weeds' to God. Let Him dig out the roots that are hindering your growth and enrich your hearts with His grace and His Spirit. Maybe it is time to call the Gardener in...




